

Howard County REACT

While not our normal busy time of the year, this winter certainly has kept Howard County *REACT* on its toes.

Starting with the Girls on The Run 5k, our team was once again tasked to provide course communications, parking control, and safety for

the 4th year in a row.. Girls on The Run is an organization focused on empowering and educating young girls in critical life skills. As in year's past, this event went off without a hitch and actually achieved some of the largest numbers of participants we've seen yet!

Other reports include an incident on December 22nd, when team member Mark Thornton (Unit 685) came across a vehicle accident on Interstate 95 in which the tire came off of one vehicle, causing another to hit it. While no one was injured, Mark stayed with the accident until Howard County Fire and & Rescue arrived on scene.

Winter weather also played into this month's report. A small, but under-forecasted snow storm hit our area on January 7th bringing about 3 inches of snow, but considering forecasters only predicted a dusting, caused major chaos. This is because local road crews didn't place down salt brine or prepare snow plows at full readiness ahead of the storm.

As a result, team President David Perry(Unit 687) and Anna Pelletier (Unit 614) had to assist motorists on several occasions including a vehicle accident on Woodstock Road and another incident involving numerous stuck vehicles on a hill further down the same road. When David and Anna arrived at the second incident, they immediately realized no one should try to go down the hill as it was a solid sheet of ice and contacted Howard County Police about the hazard. After assisting numerous motorists resume their journey, David & Anna advised the remaining drivers of the hazard and convinced them to turn around until county police arrived and shut down the road..

The last major incident of the month involved an impaired driver discovered by David & Anna. While on their way home, David noticed a vehicle on the side of the road that appeared to be high-sided on a hill, unable to move. He also noticed that the tire tracks from the vehicle ran through a field up to the point the vehicle became stuck and not directly from the road... very unusual. Once they pulled over, they noticed the vehicle was still running and was revving in high RPMs. Upon further examination, David found the driver hunched over the steering wheel.



With this discovery, David opened the door and woke up the driver. The driver seemed very incoherent. David then indicated to Anna to contact police and EMS after asking the driver several questions to which the driver gave disconnected answers... indicating the driver was either intoxicated or having a medical emergency (possibly diabetic). After a few minutes of communication, the driver indicated he wanted to drive away. David was able to distract him and removed the keys from the ignition, hiding them in the vehicle until EMS arrived because the driver was in no condition to drive.

Once EMS arrived, the driver refused medical treatment. The driver was then questioned by police. While making a statement to the police, the driver then became very belligerent. It is unknown what happened after this as David & Anna continued home.

Citizens Band is NOT Dead!

I hear all the time from *REACT* members that CB radio is dead.

Just because you don't hear anyone doesn't mean that CB is dead!

There just isn't anyone talking on Ch. 19. Here's a thought: How about monitoring CB Radio Channel-19 and every 30 Minutes, give out your Team name? "This is ABC REACT Unit 1 monitoring channel-19 for any emergency or anyone needing information or help."

This will get the name *REACT* out there.

You know, maybe you may save a life! You talking may get the attention of a driver who is tired and fatigued and may keep them from having an Accident!

When I travel, I hear a lot on CB-19 but when I get into a small town, I don't hear anyone on the CB Radio. That is, until I key up and say "Break 19... anyone monitoring?"

BAM! someone usually comes back to me.

You never know who is on the CB Radio. Just because you don't hear anyone doesn't mean CB is Dead!!

I was blocking the right lane on a highway due to a broken down 18 Wheeler and I was on CB-19 telling everyone to get over into the left lane. Some trucks did and some did not. The ones who didn't probably did not have a CB Radio. When they got up to me, I asked "do you have a CB? Most said 'No', but next time they will!

REACT is not an Amateur Radio Club. It is *REACT!* We use CB Radio, Amateur, MURS, GMRS and FRS but CB Radio is Number 1 in times of Emergencies. Amateur Radio is Number 2. People will go to CB Radio in

times of an emergency like storms, accidents and any kind of road problem. YOU WILL NOT GET TRAFFIC INFO ON AMATEUR RADIO; YOU WILL ON CB RADIO CHANNEL-19.

If you are not monitoring CB Radio in times of emergencies, how can people get HELP from *REACT* if *REACT* is not there?? **I am not putting Amateur Radio Down.** I am an Amateur Radio Operator and I still help people on CB Radio. Some people do not know *REACT* is still alive! I tell them, 'Yes, but most Teams went to Amateur Radio and GMRS and have dropped CB Radio.

CB Radio is what made *REACT*, and it can still help us stay Alive and Going and with Amateur Radio. You don't give up on CB just because you don't hear anyone on it. What good is *REACT* if no one can get help on the CB Radio?

And if you are working an event or incident as a *REACT* member and/or Team, use Your *REACT* Hat and Shirt. Wearing CERT or some other Agency apparel when representing *REACT* is counter-productive to publicizing *REACT*.

I find myself sitting in my little cozy office with the realization that the snow is piled up high (someplace else); that cold winter winds are blowing across the countryside, chilling people to the bone (someplace else); rivers are rising and the landscape is flooding (someplace else); and the sun is shining and the air is warm and people are in shirtsleeves; not someplace else, but right here. At the places mentioned above, First Responders are calling upon their training, experience, and equipment, to aid their communities, and hopefully save lives.

These responders are effective because they have those three life-saving elements of training, experience, and equipment. I feel certain that these elements give them almost superpowers to perform when duty calls. It would be foolish to think that their training would not continue or evolve, or that experiences would not be shared among the teams and agencies, or that all the equipment would be packed up and stored untouched and unmaintained until the next demand for their use.

Of course we must recognize many of these locations need to respond frequently and often close together; a plus for their preparedness. When called to duty, both professional and volunteers work together, each knowing the others have their back. But what if that someplace is not someplace else? So, what are the chances of something happening in our area that we see happening someplace else?

Floods and fires seem to be our lot in this corner of the world. Any of those were to happen

here, they could reach disaster proportions. Also on the list of potential disaster sources would be earthquakes and tsunamis. Those last two, should they happen, could endanger a large proportion of the population with little or no warning. What are the chances it would affect you, or your neighborhood, or close friends and co-workers, maybe everyone?

Past events show that agencies limited resources would soon be tapped out, leaving the bulk of the population without aid or assistance or resources. Things don't happen without information to direct recovery. That information comes with established communications and their trained operators. So our best hope to assist the recovery is our training, experience, and our prepared equipment. There is one other element to strengthen our efforts. We need people, trained and qualified to meet the needs as they arise, so that when that "someplace" is where you are, *REACT* will be there.

"Nuf said..."


